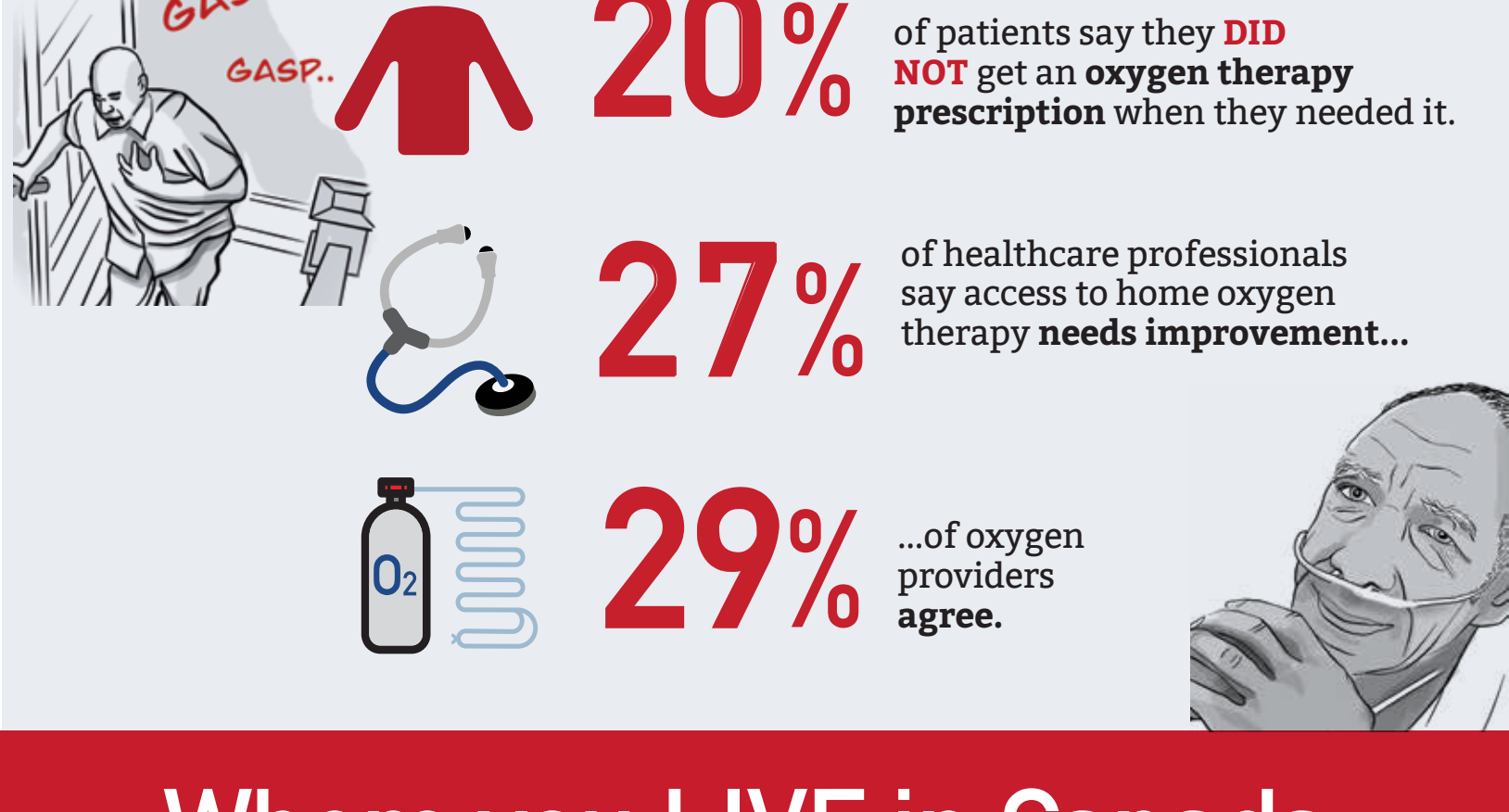

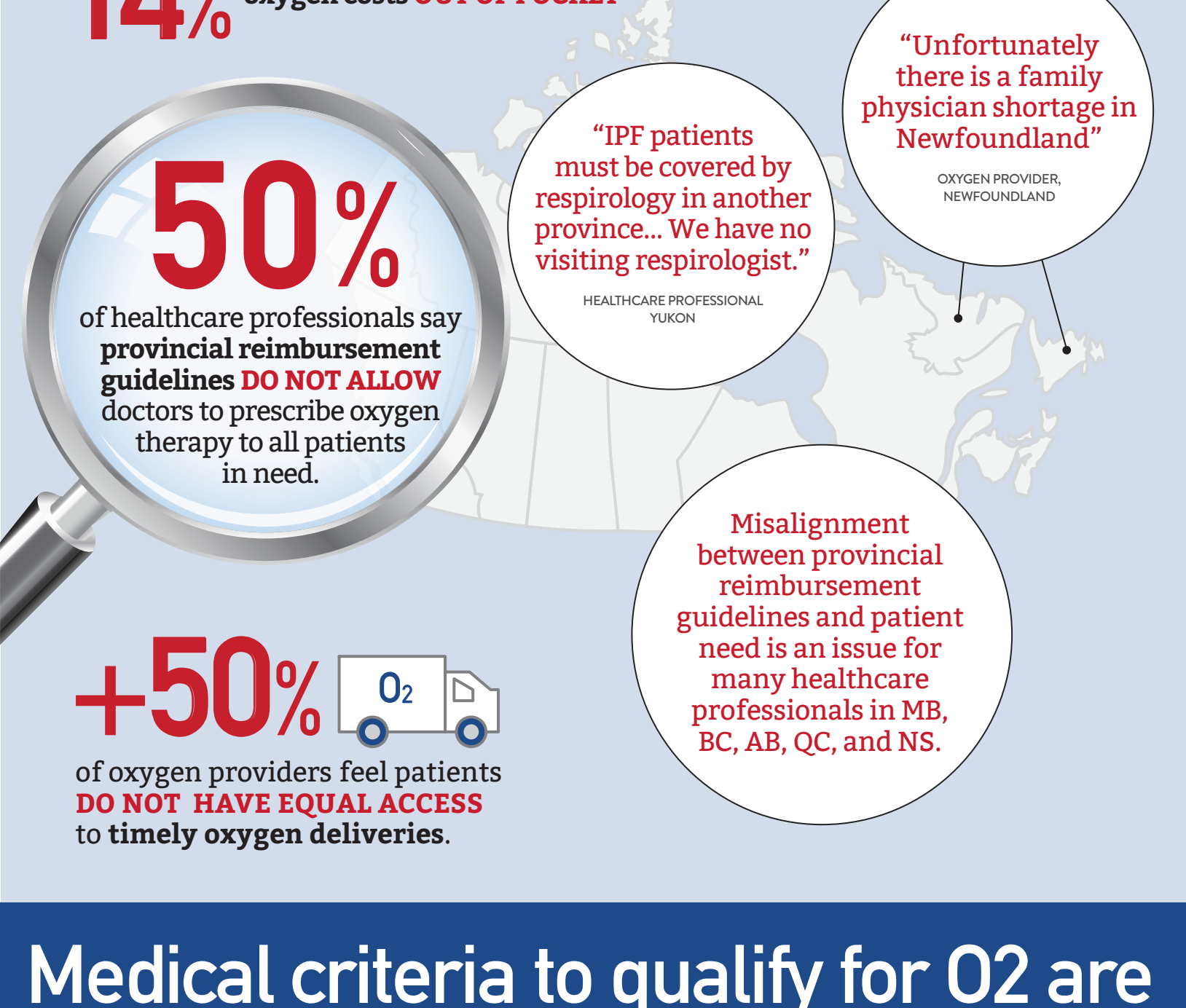


All parties agree oxygen therapy is difficult to access



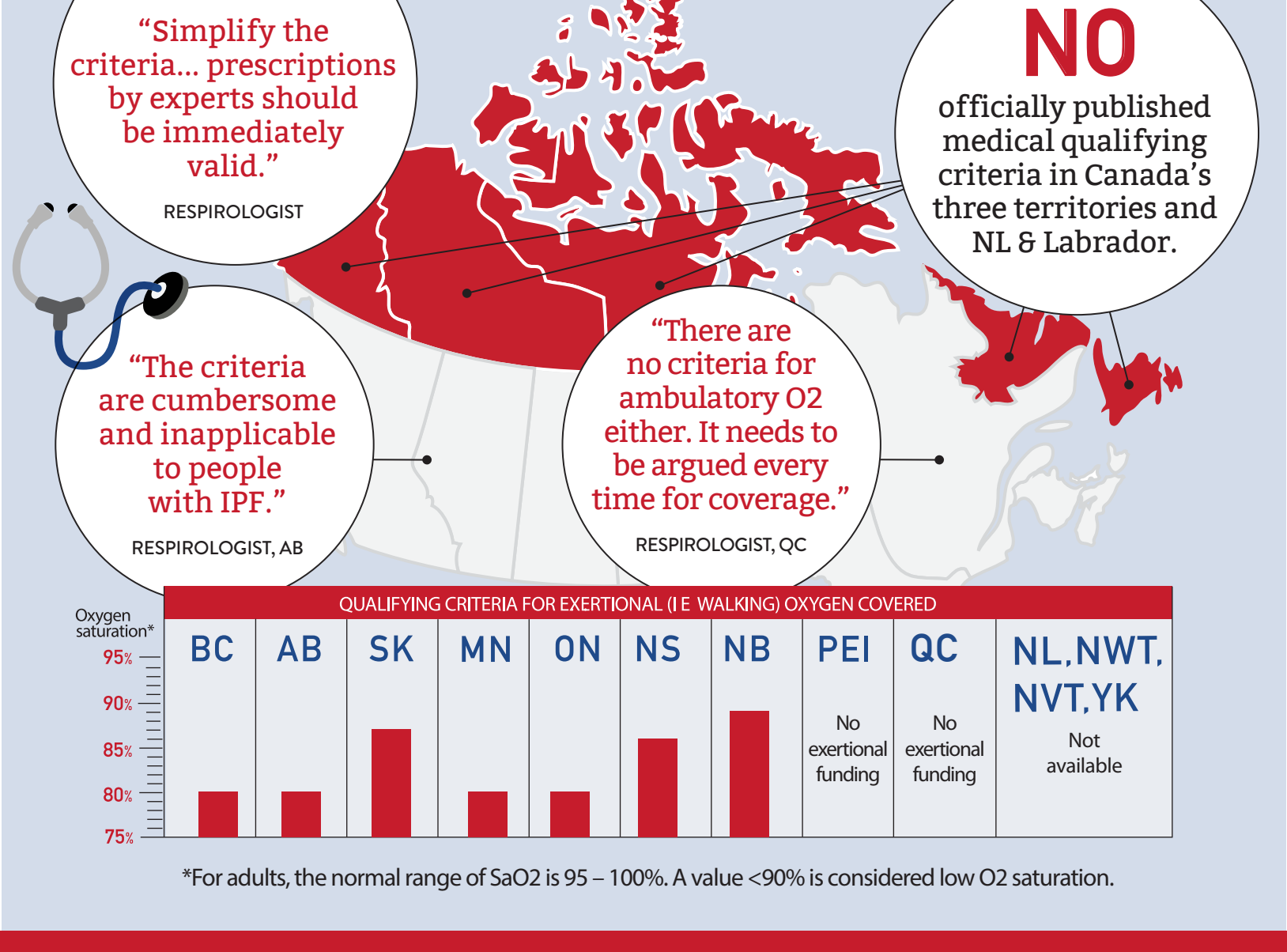
Where you LIVE in Canada determines what you GET
